
Franklin County

GEOGRAPHIC DESCRIPTION

Seventh in land area among Virginia counties, Franklin County is bounded on the north by Roanoke and Bedford Counties, on the east by Pittsylvania County, on the south by Henry and Patrick Counties, and on the west by Floyd County. The Town of Rocky Mount is the county seat and the County's largest incorporated town. The Town of Boones Mill, the village of Ferrum, and the Smith Mountain Lake area are also population centers. Franklin County's population, according to the 2000 Census population for the County was 47,286; the 2010 Census population was 56,159; and the 2020 Census population was 54,477. (The 2000 population from the Census Bureau includes the Town of Rocky Mount. On June 30, 2000, Rocky Mount annexed a portion of Franklin County through a voluntary settlement agreement. The 2000 Census data does not reflect the annexation of 654 persons and 1.53 square miles by Rocky Mount.)


